Inhalation

Over exposure resulting from prolonged and repeated inhalation of dust containing crystalline silica can cause bronchitis, silicosis (scarring of the lung.) It may also increase the risk of scleroderma (a disease affecting the connective tissue of the skin, joints, blood vessels and internal organs) and lung cancer. Epidemiological studies have shown that smoking increases the risk of bronchitis, silicosis (scarring of

the lung) and lung cancer in persons exposed to crytalline silica.

Skin

Prolonged and repeated skin contact with cement in wet concrete, mortars and slurries may cause both irritant dermatitis and allergic (contact) dermatitis. The latter is due to the presence of traces of water

soluble hexavalent chromium in cement.

Health Hazard Summary

Slightly corrosive. Avoid eye or skin contact or dust inhalation. This product has the potential to cause acute and chronic health effects with over exposure. Crystalline silica can cause silicosis (lung disease) with chronic over exposure, however due to low levels present and product application, adverse health effects are not anticipated. Crystalline silica and hexavalent chromium compounds are classified as carcinogenic to humans (IARC Group 1).

Eye

Corrosive. Severe irritant upon contact with powder/dust. Over exposure may result in pain, redness,

corneal burns and ulceration with possible permanent damage.

Inhalation

Slightly corrosive. Over exposure may result in severe mucous membrane irritation and bronchitis. Hexavalent chromium is reported to cause respiratory sensitisation, however due to the trace amount

present, a hazard is not anticipated under normal conditions of use.

CEMENT CONTACT DERMATITIS: Individuals using wet cement, mortar, grout or concrete could be at risk of developing cement dermatitis. Symptoms of exposure include itchy, tender, swollen, hot, cracked or blistering skin with the potential for sensitisation. The dermatitis is due to the presence of soluble (hexavalent) chromium.
