# 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

## Inhalation:

Remove victim from area of exposure - avoid becoming a casualty. Remove contaminated clothing and loosen remaining clothing. Allow patient to assume most comfortable position and keep warm. Keep at rest until fully recovered. Seek medical advice if effects persist.

#### Skin Contact:

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# 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

## **Hazards from combustion products:**

## **Emergency procedures:**

## Methods and materials for containment and clean up:

SMALL SPILLS: Slippery when wet. Avoid accidents, clean up immediately. Collect in a container for disposal via special chemical waste collection.

Slippery when spilt. Avoid accidents, clean up immediately. Contain - prevent run off into drains and LARGE SPILLS: waterways. Use absorbent (soil, sand or other inert material). Collect and seal in properly labelled containers or drums for disposal.

Store in cool place and out of direct sunlight. Keep containers closed when not in use - check regularly for leaks.

### Precautions for safe handling:

Keep out of reach of children. Avoid eye contact and repeated or prolonged skin contact.
